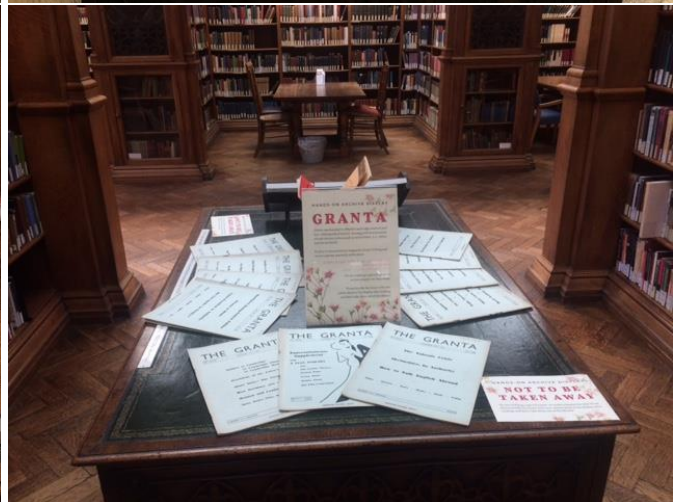


Newnham College Library displays

Guidelines on what to prepare:

- One eye-catching poster to attract browsers, with similar images that we can use to promote the display on social media.
- One larger caption explaining the theme.
- Around 20 books: try to include at least one periodical (we have a range of bound periodicals in the basement, and issues of current journals by the beanbags) and one DVD. It is also useful to have some back-up items that we can use to restock the display when books get borrowed.
- Captions with references. Please let us know if you need help with this.
- A whiteboard for suggestions or lots of recommendation slips.

We can provide book stands, printing, laminate cases, trolleys, and lots of help with referencing and finding resources on iDiscover.

We also have regular exhibitions of rare books in the exhibition cases in the upstairs lift corridor of the Horner Markwick library.



If you are interested in working with us to extend your display to a full exhibition, try using Advanced Search, narrowing the Library to Newnham College and the date to pre-1850, to find rare books on iDiscover:
